The AOANJRR was established in 1999 to improve outcomes for patients having joint replacement surgery. The information collected has been very important in improving outcomes for patients.

The Registry now wants to collect additional information directly from patients. This will enable a better understanding of how you are feeling, the problems you are having with the joint before your operation, and the changes you experience following surgery.

WHAT WILL I NEED TO DO?

All you will need to do is answer a few questions via a secure website, once before your operation and once 6-months after your operation. The Registry will remind you when to complete the questions after your operation, so you do not need to remember.

WILL MY DATA BE PROTECTED?

All data will be collected through a secure Registry website. Your personal data is confidential, and many measures are in place to protect your information and make sure it is secure. Only you, and if you give permission, your surgeon can review your results.
